The cool Pacific Ocean breezes that are driven into the Willamette Valley through the Van Duzer Corridor, ending just west of our vineyards, moderate our sunny summer days. Founded in 2003, Left Coast Cellars carefully crafts award-winning, estate-grown Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris, Pinot Blanc, Chardonnay and Syrah on Oregon's 45th parallel.
Our estate consists of 306 acres, 104 of which are devoted to the cultivation of grapes. The remainder of the property is preserved as one of the last stands of old growth white oak trees in the area and also contains

fruit orchards and streams. The bodies of water attract migrating birds and encourage birds of prey, helping to balance animal life in the vineyards. Working to fulfill our commitments to the strengths and benefits of biodiversity, we strive to be the best possible stewards of the land.
