Left Coast Cellars is situated directly on the 45th parallel. Our sustainably farmed 130 acres of estate vineyards are planted on fractured stone soils with varying slopes and elevations. The union of these differing microclimates contribute to the complexities and subtleties in all of our wines. The cool Pacific Ocean breezes that are driven into the Willamette Valley through the Van Duzer Corridor, ending just west of our vineyards, moderate our sunny summer days. It is this precise combination of geography and geology that gives our wines a distinct sense of place.

Founded in 2003, Left Coast Cellars carefully crafts award-winning, estate-grown Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris, Pinot Blanc, Chardonnay and Syrah on Oregon's 45th parallel. Our estate consists of 356 acres, 130 of which are devoted to the cultivation of grapes. The remainder of the property is preserved as one of the last stands of old growth white oak trees in the grap and also contains growth white oak trees in the area and also contains

fruit orchards and streams. The bodies of water attract migrating birds and encourage birds of prey, helping to balance animal life in the vineyards. Working to fulfill our commitments to the strengths and benefits of biodiversity, we strive to be the best possible stewards of the land.
